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Erasmus

The Erasmus sub-programme is designed for institutions and organisations providing or facilitating the teaching and learning of formal higher education and vocational education and training.

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Types of centralised actions (1/2)

Multilateral project
aims to create **concrete deliverables** such as learning, testing and training materials, new curricula, strategy and policy documents developed jointly by a formal or informal grouping of organisations or institutions.

Multilateral network
aims to **enable organisations with shared interests to work together on specific themes**: strategic reflections, needs analyses, networking activities (i.e. digital educational services, educational support needs, education for specific groups).

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Types of centralised actions (2/2)

Accompanying measures

are short-term or one-off activities that support awareness-raising and general objectives of the Programme (i.e. Conferences, seminars, publications).

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Erasmus Multilateral (1/5)

1. Increasing attainment levels and strengthening the social dimension of higher education:

- increase access to and improve the social dimension in higher education.
- widen the participation and raise completion rates of underrepresented groups and non-traditional learners
- enhance lifelong learning via the creation of flexible learning paths,
- develop ways to increase the social responsibility of higher education institutions,
- improve gender balance on particularly unbalanced fields of study.

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Erasmus Multilateral (2/5)

2. Improving the quality and relevance of higher education, including through cooperation between HEIs and the labour market:

- attune curricula to current and emerging labour market demands and offer employability and transversal skills such as entrepreneurship,
- develop active cooperation between HEI and partners from outside academia

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Erasmus Multilateral (3/5)

3. Strengthening quality through mobility and cross-border cooperation:

- develop innovative strategies to boost mobility or ways to remove obstacles to mobility in higher education
- support virtual mobility as a global strategy for the effective integration of ICT in the participating HEIs.

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Erasmus Multilateral (4/5)

4. Knowledge Alliances (action limited to 2 years)

- bring together businesses and HEIs to strengthen and develop Europe's innovation potential
- facilitate the sharing of knowledge between HE and companies
- embody a truly two-way process: universities and business joining forces to boost their innovation potential.

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Erasmus Multilateral (5/5)

5. Improving governance and funding:

- develop the strategic capacities of HEIs and their leaders,
- enhance the autonomy and accountability of institutions;
- increase institutions' capacity to draw in funding from diverse sources and manage resources efficiently.

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Erasmus Networks

- promote European co-operation and innovation specific subject areas
- enhance quality of teaching in HE,
- define and develop a European dimension within a given academic discipline, furthering innovation and exchanging methodologies and good practices.
- Cooperation within the network between HEIs, university faculties and departments
- may involve professional associations and enterprises as well as other organisations.

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Erasmus Accompanying Measures

- relevant to the European Modernisation Agenda of HE and raising awareness of the importance of European cooperation in the field of HE;
- enhance the implementation of Erasmus mobility
- focus on dissemination of project results
- foster trans-sectoral synergies between the actions of the LLP on precise themes;
- implement activities specifically concerning aspects of transversal policies in which the Erasmus programme is called upon to play a part
- Carry out other activities focussing on specific themes, target groups or contexts

Multilateral projects	200.000 €/year (total grant max 400.000 €)	Max: 3 years	Min. 3 LLP countries
Multilateral networks	Total grant max 600.000 €	Max: 3 years	Min. 25 LLP countries
Accompanying Measures	Total grant max 150.000 €	Max: 1 year	1 LLP country
